## Diary Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> April 2017

### Way to school:

After school we went to the parking area and there we waited for the bus that would take us to the museum called „History center Dybbol Banke“. After having arrived, we ran into the building because of the annoying weather. It was raining all the time and some of us were freezing. As soon as we were inside we wanted to eat our sandwiches, but that wasn't really allowed... so we had to go out again. But the sandwiches were amazing- they saved the whole day.



### The after school programme:

The museum was all about the war between Denmark and Prussia in 1864. We watched some films and we saw a model of the battlefield. We also worked on some stations which the teachers showed us. We could make our own pancakes on open fire and we could write letters to our families in the perspective of a soldier. After that we marched like real soldiers and our guide taught us how.
